Chile's ex-chief negotiator drops a bombshell

Proof that even TPP lead negotiators think the TPPA is dangerous! Chile's former chief Rodrigo Contreras published an <u>opinion piece</u> just before the Lima round warning that the current text could become 'a threat for our countries: it will restrict our development options in health and education, in biological and cultural diversity, and in the design of public policies and the transformation of our economies.' And it was likely to spark a backlash from social movements.

Activists hard at work at the 18th Lima round

- a video: Our rights are not negotiable, with English subtitles
- an EFF dispatch from the picket line outside the closed-door #TPP
- a new cartoon video on Internet and TPPA from Electronic Frontier Foundation.
- a <u>petition</u> setting bottom lines for any more concessions to the US. Peru's <u>Redge</u> activists have a strong 'TPP not negotiable' campaign on mining that profiled the dispute (in Spanish). (Peru already has a US FTA.).

A New Global Alliance Forms To Fight For A Fair Deal On Copyright Online

OurFairDeal.org takes the NZ based campaigns a giant leap forward with a global alliance of 84 lobby groups demanding a fair deal in Global copyright and trade in intellectual property (including branded goods). The alliance spans 6 countries across the Asia Pacific including US-based Fight for the Future, the Australian Library & Information Association, Japan-based Movement for the Internet Active Users and US-based Open Media.

Monsanto, TPPA and International Day of Action

The GE/TPPA link featured in marches around the country as part of the international day of action against Monsanto in around 40 countries. In Christchurch Christine Dann gave a great speech to around 300 people. Graeme O'Brien spoke to the rally at Nelson. Some members of the new group 'It's Our Future; It's Our Food' spoke at the March Against Monsanto rally in Auckland, raising awareness about how TPPA could open the door to unlabelled GMOs in our food supply.

'It's Our Future; It's Our Food'

A number of food sovereignty activists concerned about the various impacts that the TPPA will have on food systems have formed 'It's Our Future; It's Our Food'. They are preparing material and projects in lead up to the Malaysia round of negotiation in July. Jane Kelsey pointed out in a <u>Herald op ed</u> that governments could be sued under the TPPA in off-shore pro investor tribunals for changing laws that did not directly breach the contract. There are lots of US <u>shareholders</u> in Sky City already.
